- Over 45,000 Letters Generated from the Rutgers Community to Congress in Support of DACA
- Rutgers Immigrant Community Assistance Project

- Tuition Assistance Grants Secured for Dreamers by Murphy Administration
- Declaration of Support from Rutgers entered as part of New Jersey's Legal Intervention in Federal DACA Case
- Rutgers-Newark Chancellor Cantor Co-chairs the Presidents' Alliance on Higher Education and Immigration

Promoting Faculty Diversity

Progress is being made....

- Nearly \$22m committed to recruiting, hiring, and retaining diverse faculty members
- Last year, 40% of our tenured or tenure-track appointments were faculty who self-identified as being from underrepresented groups

But more work needs to be done....

- Despite efforts, overall demographics have been slow to change
- Uneven hiring practices make data hard to track


Mentoring and Supporting a Diverse Faculty

- Rutgers Connection Network pairs faculty members with mentors from across Rutgers
- OASIS Leadership and Professional Development Program is a semester-long program designed to accelerate career advancement for female faculty members.
- Program for Early Career Excellence focuses on diverse faculty early in their careers and provides them with the mentoring, professional development, and workshops that will help to ensure their success as assistant professor
- Over 100 faculty members participated in these programs last year

Community-Wide Commitment to Student Diversity

- Rutgers-Camden:
 - 2/3 of the incoming class is either black or Hispanic
- Rutgers-Newark:
 - 59% increase in enrollment among Newark residents since 2013 through City of Learning Collaborative
- Rutgers-New Brunswick:
 - Leading the B1G in graduation rates for students receiving Pell Grants

Paul Robeson Plaza Groundbreaking

- Memorial Plaza project has been led by Class of 1971 and Rutgers African-American Alumni Alliance
- Centennial of Paul Robeson,
 Class of 1919 Valedictorian
- Plaza will be constructed in coming year near Ford Hall on the College Avenue campus
- Buildings and centers on every campus have been named for Paul Robeson



Middle States Accreditation

- Reaffirmed accreditation for the next nine years
- No corrective measures necessary
- University was commended for "living a deeper mission than its focus on excellence in teaching, research, and service. Their focus on affordability and accessibility across geography, and economic, ethnic, and racial differences is noteworthy."
- A community effort involving students, faculty, staff, and board members






New Brunswick Performing Arts Center




Continued Cost Pressures on the University

New Brunswick: Pays, on average, \$267 toward tuition and fees




Newark: Tuition and fees are completely covered with \$44 of aid remaining



Camden: Tuition and fees are completely covered with \$132 of aid remaining

Incoming cohorts include first-time, full-time in-state undergraduates awarded any Title IV federal aid (grants, loans, work study)

Solid Bond Ratings

- S&P Global Rating affirmed A+/Stable long-term rating for Rutgers' bonds
- S&P noted Rutgers' sound financial policies, favorable enrollment trends, and high student quality and graduate rates
- Moody's reaffirmed Aa3 rating
- Major risk identified by both rating agencies: low level of unrestricted net assets coupled with narrow operating margin

RUTGERS Collective Negotiations Update

- Unionized Workforce Profile
 - 20,000 unionized employees
 - 24 negotiating units
 - 19 staff units
 - 5 academic units
- Negotiations Progress
 - At the table with 21 negotiating units
 - 16 staff units
 - 5 academic units
 - Held 117 negotiating sessions since March 2018
 - 87 sessions with staff units
 - 30 sessions with academic units
 - Settled and ratified 2 agreements
 - Teamsters
 - FOP Superiors (includes merger of legacy UMDNJ and legacy Rutgers FOP Superiors unit into one unit)


State Advocacy

 - Additional commitment for FY19 anticipated
- Increased Rutgers Minimum Wage for Student Workers to \$11 per hour


One-Stop Student Services Centers

Ongoing Efforts to Improve the Bus Experience

- Rutgers operates the 2nd largest bus fleet in the state, behind NJ Transit
- 60,000 rides on a typical day
- Added 18 buses
- Through improved scheduled, *reduced* ridership by 10% over three years ago
- Launched bus tracking app
- Removed articulated buses

A New State of Health

Rutgers – RWJBarnabas Partnership

- RBHS and RWJBarnabas Health signed a master affiliation agreement on July 24, 2018
- Shared objective: to collaborate to form a world-class academic health center that functions as one system



Mutual Goals

- Develop a world-class academic health system for New Jersey
- Recruit leading academic, research, and clinical faculty
- Consolidate clinical services under RWJBH leadership, while respecting traditional academic reporting structure
- Focus academic, educational, and research efforts within Rutgers
- Dedicate collective resources to education, research, and health improvement to benefit patients, students, and all of New Jersey
- Capitalize on the strength of the Rutgers Health brand









Master Affiliation Agreement Highlights

- Transforming academic health care in New Jersey:
 - \$100 million initial investment, functions as endowment
 - \$10 million set aside to retain top students who remain with RWJBH/RU post-residency
 - \$50 million/year in fixed mission support
 - Variable mission support based on RWJBH financial success
 - Recruitment of approximately 100 new faculty investigators over 10 years doubles RBHS research portfolio


Inaugural Health Care Symposium
